Purchasing Logistics with a Global Perspective

10 ECTS credits

The aim of the course is to give advanced knowledge of logistics in purchasing and supply chain management with a global perspective. The focus is on the purchasing functions importance for the company result. The course includes the following elements:

- · Purchasing and strategic sourcing
- · Competitive purchasing, latest research
- Supply chain management, Globalization and Incoterms
- Initiate supplier relations: define needs, specify and document
- · Assess supplier portfolio, select suppliers
- Prepare negotiations with regard to TCO and cost break-down
- Legal aspects, contracts, delivery and payment terms and contract management
- Supplier relations: different levels of interaction
- Sustainability and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR)
- · Purchase orders
- Performance measurements (KPIs), and supplier evaluation
- Supplier development process
- Terminate supplier relations

PREREQUISITES

- 60 credits first cycle courses in industrial engineering or business administration or equivalent
- Fluency in English equivalent to at least 575 (paper based test) or 90 (internet based test) TOEFL score (or equivalent)

Global Perspective on Health and Welfare

10 ECTS credits

The aim of the course is to provide knowledge and understanding of the global situation related to health and welfare. The course includes elements such as:

- UN Sustainable Development Goals in relation to health and welfare
- Cultural aspects related to health and welfare
- Impact of common diseases/disabilities in diverse cultural contexts from different professional perspective and from a public health perspective
- Complexity and impact of social determinants of health in different countries
- International Classification on Functioning Disability and Health (ICF)
- Community development and its relevance to ensure quality and safety with organizations in a global health context
- Awareness of facilitators and barriers for implementing human rights
- Contextual factors and appropriate scientific research methods when working in diverse contexts

- 30 credits first cycle courses in any educational area
- Fluency in English equivalent to at least 575 (paper based test) or 90 (internet based test) TOEFL score (or equivalent)

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
