

GENERAL ASSEMBLY Online, 01.12.23 13:00-14:30 CET

1. Welcome

1.1. Introduction

It was communicated that the COHEHRE team had their kick-off last week, after the symposium. The team got together to not only brainstorm on the future activities but also on keeping COHEHRE on track.

The focus will lie on:

- Blowing new life into COHEHRE
 with the help of our voluntary COHEHRE committee members (Content, Organisation,
 Communication & Marketing Committees)
- How to reach everybody within our member organisations?
 Last week, the symposium has shown that participants from member institutions didn't know about COHEHRE's existence prior to this activity.
- For what concerns activities and keeping COHEHRE on track we will:
 - Adopt a new strategy on the conference which will include training (see below)
 - Organise activities that serve different groups of people within the institutions to give members a bigger return on their membership fees.
 - Attract new people to come into our committees to bring fresh ideas, to put COHEHRE and its activities firmly on the map f.ex. committee members with a scientific background to help with reviewing abstract, to bring new ideas on research activities
 - Develop a better, more effective communication strategy
 f.ex. Linkedin to increase visibility online, communicating activities well beforehand
 - Attract new members
 f.ex. by offering attractive fees to first timers to lower the threshold to participate in COHEHRE activities
 - Organise more budget-friendly activities
 COHEHRE is not free of the challenges that are involved in the financial part of organising activities. Tracks are being investigated on how to reduce the cost of organising an activity without compromising on quality.

- Sandra Tricas-Sauras from Erasmus Hogeschool Brussel, Belgium
- Julie Vanderlinden from Odisee University of Applied Sciences, Belgium

3. Activities

3.1. Spring activities

- Train future managers in health education
- Living labs

The following questions and remarks arose from the members:

- Will the spring activities be online as well as physical activities?
- It was encouraged to organize workshops for a mix of students and staff.
- It was generally preferred to hold the conference in Spring as it doesn't collide with other big conferences/gatherings in Autumn.
- Earlier communication would be advisable.
- It was recommended to spread more detailed information on the activities before the end of December which will enable the members to plan it in.

COHEHRE is planning on bringing back the conference in Spring but seeing that the next year's host hasn't been confirmed yet, it is impossible to hold the conference then.

All the above remarks and suggestions will be taken into consideration.

3.2. Autumn activities

It was announced that for 2024 the student and staff conference will be split. After 2024, student and staff conference will be held together again. This is down to organizational aspects since the host hasn't been confirmed yet.

• COHEHRE Staff Conference

At the kick-off, the workload of the host in organising a conference has been investigated which resulted in a new format.

o 2-in-1 format:

 Specific training on 3 different topics to choose from + certificate of training

- Conference incl. keynote, networking, scientific programme, round table, sharing outcomes
 - + certificate of conference attendance
- Involve 5 students per training since the focus lies on developing something for students
- Scientific programme still a strong part within the conference.

• COHEHRE Student Conference

Will be organized at a different location in Autumn. This will be communicated asap.

Questions and remarks arose from the members on the following topics:

- Conference student and staff will only be split for once.
- EAIE will take place in September, which might collide with the conference.
- It was suggested to connect the COHEHRE conference to another conference. As resources are getting smaller, a selection in activities to attend needs to be made at every institution.
- There is less money and time to participate. After Covid, the attendance of the conference won't be what it was like before.
- It was proposed to combine student and staff in one conference. This would make it easier to attend and to get money from the deans.
- It was also thought that it would involve less work if students could attend the staff conference. The students could join all the KN and afterwards come together with teachers.
- Another suggestion was to get another member institution involved in organising the student part within a staff conference.

COHEHRE is aware of the importance of keeping student and staff conference connected. Our goal is to strengthen the link between student and staff conference instead of holding it parallel.

The separate conference event will be just a one-off. The difficulty of finding a host for the conference resulted in this one-off separation stint but also pushed us to revise the format to reduce the workload involved in the organization.

All the comments and suggestions will be taken into consideration.
