Programme Overview

Content of the BIP

The programme consists of an intensive five-day face-to-face training programme, preceded by a virtual component (see schedule).

Course language: English

Objectives and description

What participants need to bring with them:

- Openness to roles
- Openness to professions
- Cultural openness
- Openness to interprofessional cooperation
- Openness to international cooperation
- B2-level language skills in English as a minimum requirement



Learning Outcomes

- Participants transfer their individual action processes to possible (new) fields of action.
- Participants work within interprofessional teams to create possible role models with corresponding task descriptions and competency descriptions for other health professions.
- Participants describe possible professional fields with a focus on interprofessional work.
- Participants analyse complex care situations that have been brought in from different disciplines/professions.
- Participants develop interprofessional recommendations for individuals and groups.
- Participants consider the basic principles of public health, health promotion, and health literacy in their elaborations.
- Participants create possible clinical pathways for selected clients/patients.
- Participants develop ways to find a common language for case discussions in teams.
- In interprofessional case discussions, participants show understanding and respect for the roles of the other professions.

Book your own accommodation

The programme takes place in Linz, a city with a rich industrial heritage and a vibrant cultural scene. Rent a bike or e-scooter or take long walks along the Danube, Linz's waterway. Educational activities take place on/near our central campus. Project work takes place all over Linz but is easily accessible by public transport and with the help of your local buddies.

You get to book your own accommodation. Students usually book Airbnb's or ho(s)tel rooms. On a smaller budget you can share a dormitory or family room, such as at "Mama Muh – takes care of you" in the city centre. Staying in a hostel or shared apartment gives you more opportunities to get to know each other, have fun together, network and plan social time.

Funding



Incoming international students are invited to apply for an Erasmus+ funding (short term blended mobility) at their home university. If granted, it covers travel & accommodation & subsistence.

If your home university does not provide Erasmus+, you are welcome to join anyway!

As an incoming international student, you will upload your **Learning Agreement** following the instructions provided to you by your home university's International Coordinator. Once you have followed the procedure, we will be able to approve your Learning Agreement online. At the end of the programme, all students receive a **Certificate of Attendance** and a **Transcript of Records**.

Payment for accommodation and subsistence in Linz

- Students are required to pay for the costs of their own accommodation.
- As the programme is funded by Erasmus+, participants do not pay tuition fees for activities or the social-cultural programme.

After your application has been confirmed by the UAS for Health Professions Upper Austria, you will receive the payment details/payment deadline.

Do you plan extra time in Austria?

If you are planning an extra holiday in Austria, we recommend that you arrive before the course and book a few nights in a youth hostel in Vienna or Salzburg. These beautiful and exciting cities are only an 1.5-hour train ride away from Linz.

Transportation
